WHAT IS CONSTRUCTION YORK?

Construction York is an initiative funded by the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, and delivered by CHY Consultancy in partnership with City of York Council. It ran from October 2024 until March 2025.

Its aim was to address the skills gap in York's construction sector, building on existing frameworks to connect the industry and encourage more local people into the sector – particularly those facing barriers to entry.

WHY WAS IT NEEDED?

Construction York was established in anticipation of a surge of construction projects in York in coming years.

York has a wealth of opportunity for the construction sector – training providers, businesses, community groups, schools and colleges – but these can be fragmented. Construction York aimed to join the dots, fostering the beginnings of a more collaborative ecosystem.

HOW WE APPROACHED IT

Construction York brought stakeholders together, providing a connection point and a central hub for developers, suppliers, training providers, and those looking for work or to upskill.

The Construction York team also explored new channels to find talent, targeting underserved communities.

HIGHLIGHT:

HATCH DIGITAL #5IN5

Pilot of initiative supporting the reintegration of skilled prison leavers into work.

Delivered by Hatch Digital, enabled by CHY Consultancy and Construction York.

Over 5 days, the team visited 4 Yorkshire prisons, profiling individuals' existing skills, experience, aptitudes, and passions, producing in-depth, personalised reports that are supplementary to a conventional CV.

The team also conducted 1-2-1 coaching sessions - supporting inmates, the Prison Employment Leads (PEL) and education teams on how to use these reports effectively.

Each report provided a more personal, in-depth way for potential employers to see the person behind the application and evaluate their potential – supporting prison leavers with rehabilitation and future employment.

HIGHLIGHT: SUPPLY CHAIN FOR GOOD EVENT

Bringing together local authority representatives, developers, contractors, community organisations, training providers and local SMEs/micro businesses to outline our approach to social value.

Connecting all key stakeholders in one room to discuss what can be achieved if we work together.

HIGHLIGHT: GETTING YORK RESIDENTS INTO WORK VIA VOCATIONAL LICENSES

Construction York ensured all York College students engaged in a construction related course had access to CSCS/ECS before they left college - meaning they can move directly into work experience on sites.

We also...

- Upskilled x2 staff from York College as invigilators for ECS cards, allowing the college to deliver training without external resource.
- Supported x3 young offenders to gain a CSCS card resulting in one being offered a job in construction.

We supplied a total of 55 CSCS Cards and 28 ECS Cards.

CONSTRUCTION YORK: THE STATS

205 people received support to gain employment (Target 20 - 1025% of target)

154 people in employment engaged with the skills system (*Target 50 - 308% of target*)

85 people received support to gain a vocational licence (Target 30 - 283% of target)

CONSTRUCTION YORK: THE STATS

65 people supported to gain a qualification

(Target 40 - 162% of target)

60 upcoming prison leavers supported to gain future employment (Target 20 - 300% of target)

110 people familiarised with employers expectations, including, standards of behaviour in the workplace
